NEW EDUCATION UNIDOS INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

On July 2016. The University South Foundation Inc., the Consulate of Mexico in Douglas, and the University of Arizona's Masters in Secondary Education Program, united together to support the First Education Unidos 2016 Internship Program. University South Foundation Inc.'s Vice President, Michael Boardman, Mexico's Consul Jorge Ernesto Espejel Montes, and UA South's Dr. Etta Kralovec signed the Education Unidos 2016 Internship Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).









The Education Unidos Internship Program took place during the fall semester in 2016 and was coordinated through the University of Arizona South's Masters in Secondary Education program. The internship program allowed participants to develop their academic skills within the city of Douglas Unified School District. The program provided participants with a unique, professional, enrichment opportunity as they focused on the social, cultural, political and economic context, that determine the education dynamic in the Mexico-Arizona cross-border region. Internship participants were of Mexican nationality and are professors in academic institutions who want to experience the cross-border culture and dynamics between Mexico and the United States. Participants gained a professional experience and improve their knowledge of the English language. Participants were also required to conduct an 'Action-Research Project' designed to improve practice for their own individual academic context in Mexico.









These four research scholars included Martha Ingrid Gutierrez Roman, Ph.D. of Tapachula, Chiapas, on the Learning process of bilingual students of the border; Fabiola Menendez Mena of Tialnepantla, Estado de Mexico, on the Experiences of binational people who cross the border every day; Dulce Azucena Rodriguez Banda of Salina Cruz, Oaxaca, on Hispanic students living on the border: Linking classroom success with their future aspirations; and Marlene Rojas Gonzalez of Atlixco, Puebla, on The impact of the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States for students in a binational high school environment.



Grant Writing Workshop

The University of Arizona South Transition to Teaching Program and the University South Foundation, Inc. hosted a two day Grant Writing Workshop. On day one, 37 teachers were instructed how to write a grant and apply for grants. On day two, each participant had three hours to write a grant proposal and budget. Then, the class formed groups to review and score all applications and select the top four scoring grants. Lora Kerr received first place. Kerr teaches AP English at Buena High School, her grant proposal is to fund a trip for her students to attend a live Shakespeare performance. Liz Kading received second place. Kading teaches at Pomerene Elementary School, her grant proposal is to

host a guest author for students at her school. Third place was awarded to Leisa Owens, a Special Education teacher at Huachuca Mountain Elementary School. Owens grant proposal is for an age appropriate science program that integrates special needs students, and includes the study of frogs and grasshoppers. Jacobo Carrasco, Science Teacher, received the fourth award for his grant proposal to start a Birding Club at Wade Carpenter Middle School in Nogales, Arizona.

The Grant Writing Workshop for Teachers Program was initiated by Dr. Etta Kralovec, Associate Professor and Director of the University of Arizona South M.Ed. program. The workshop was instructed by the successful grant writer, Melanie Greene, of m.greene Planning & Resource Development, and Ross Lampert presented grant opportunities available for teachers through the Cochise Chapter of the Air Force Association.





PATTERSON OBSERVATORY

The Patterson Observatory is listed as a **NASA Space Place** and has a 16 foot dome, housing a Ritchey-Chretien telescope of 20" aperture. This telescope, with its sophisticated detectors, is capable of observing objects one million times fainter that the human eye can detect.

In 2016 The Patterson Observatory became a member of the Museum Alliance Organization.



These "Public Nights" are free and family friendly and start about a half hour after sunset. They are weather dependent (canceled during inclement weather) and are not scheduled during the monsoon months of July and August. Public Nights are announced in the Around Your Town section of the Sierra Vista Herald, on the HAC website, and on Facebook/Patterson Observatory. The observatory is also available, by appointment, to serve youth, school and community organizations.

His legacy continues to support the Patterson Observatory and the University South Foundation.


