University South Foundation Awards \$65,000 in Scholarships in 2014

In the Spring, 10 students were awarded a total of \$20,000. Eric Bright, Jason Brumfield, and Brett Randolph received \$1,500 scholarships. Brittany Castelluccio, Deseret Harris, Robert Kelsey, Dawn Myers, and Guadalupe Tapia received \$2,000 scholarships. Craig Hopper was awarded a \$2,500 scholarship and Rebecca Bowser was awarded the \$3,000 David Patterson Memorial Scholarship. Previous scholarship winners Craig Hopper and Robert Kelsey spoke about their educational journeys and the large part both UA South and University South Foundation had in their academic and personal success.

The Mexican Consulate in Douglas, AZ, through the IME (Institute of Mexicans Abroad) Becas funds, contributed \$8,000 in scholarships to help increase the educational levels of Mexicans and Mexican-Descents living in the United States attending University of Arizona South. In addition, the University South Foundation added 50% in matching funds offering a total of \$12,000 in scholarships to four University of Arizona Douglas students, each receiving \$3,000 in scholarships. Itzel Chavez-Ramos stated that these awards make a big difference in their lives. Stephany Vanessa Quintero Galaviz thanked the Foundation for this scholarship which brings her a great feeling of content. Zueyzan Mantano shared that her scholarship will enable her to continue her university studies and reach her goal of a bachelor's degree or higher. Beatriz Greeno was honored by this scholarship and is now working as an Academic Advisor at UA Douglas.

Twelve UA South students were selected to receive scholarships in the fall of 2014. Semiramies Hastain received a \$2,000 Active Duty Military Scholarship, Cindy Chavarria-Minera, Billy Zsambok, Zueyzan Montaño and Robert Mcgrew received \$2,000 scholarships. Tyler Moore, Meagan Ellwood, Guadalupe Tapia, and Jocelyn Hernandez were awarded \$2,500 for their essays describing a local issue that concerns them. Brittany Castelluccio, Shawn Paumen were awarded \$2,500 from the Sulpher Springs Valley Electric Cooperative Scholarships. Rebecca Moore received the \$3,000 David Patterson Memorial Scholarship.

Since 2011, the University South Foundation has awarded **over \$210,500** in scholarships to students attending University of Arizona South and hopes to continue its efforts of providing financial assistance to University of Arizona South students.

The Spring 2014 the Superior Faculty Award was received by Dr. Flory Simon, and the Adjunct Faculty recipient was Dr. Linda Denno. The Fall 2013 Superior Faculty Award was received by Dr. Inger McGee and the Adjunct Faculty recipient was Michael Milazzo. Superior Faculty Award includes a \$2,500 cash award, and the Adjunct Faculty receives a \$1,500 cash award.

Outstanding Staff Awards

The University South Foundation, Inc. and the University of Arizona South Employee Recognition Committee honored four University of Arizona South employees with Outstanding Staff Awards and Innovative Staff Awards to acknowledge their extraordinary efforts towards making a difference at University of Arizona South.

Dean Shockey Award

UA South Dean, Jim Shockey, Ph.D., awarded a "Dean's Award of Excellence" to Sarah Wieland, Director, Academic Advising and Student Services at University of Arizona South. Ms. Wieland began at the University of Arizona Main and transferred to University of Arizona South in 2012. The "Dean's Award of Excellence" was awarded in the Spring of 2015 and Ms. Wieland received a certificate and a \$500 cash award.





Rwanda Field Study Scholarship

UA South graduating senior Andrea Castro took advantage of an exciting experiential opportunity to study abroad working with gorillas in Rwanda. After her essay submission, Andrea received a \$5000 scholarship from the University South Foundation to participate in the annual five week program as part of her studies.

The "hands on" Primate Studies Field School is offered each summer by Dr. Dieter Steklis, UA South professor of Anthropology and Psychology, along with his wife, Dr. Netzin Steklis, through the UofA Study Abroad & Student Exchange. Andrea was intrigued with the human to animal interactions when she heard stories of KoKo the Gorilla's remarkable signing and communication accomplishments. In the midst of her senior year, she became aware of the opportunity to study gorillas in the summer Primate Studies Field School.



Andrea said it is important not to give up on your dreams "even though I am not going to become a veterinarian or work in a medical field, I have grown to see other ways I couldn't have imaged for the humans and animal connection."

Faculty Support

The University South Foundation, Inc granted \$4,000 to Etta Kralovec for travel funds in fall, 2014. Dr. Kralovec was invited to visit teacher education programs at the University of Helsinki and the University of Turku in Finland to observe and analyze the teacher candidates' field component of their teacher education program. Dr. Kralovec attended teacher education classes, visited field sites where student teachers practiced and met with colleagues to discuss teacher education practices used in Finland. Finnish students have some of the highest test scores in the world,

due in part to their rigorous and innovative teacher education programs.

As Program Director for the Masters Education Programs at UA South, Dr. Kralovec has been actively involved in program re-design since being awarded the Transition to Teaching grant in 2011. For the last two years, they have been piloting some powerful innovations to the field component of our programs that they believe will mark UA South graduate teacher education programs as some of the most innovative in the state. Her collaboration with Finnish colleagues offered international recognized 'best practices'



in teacher education that will implemented in the program re-design work they are doing at UA South.





Student Highlight



Cindy Chavarria, is an Undergraduate student at The University of Arizona South. Ms Chavarria is studying Anthropology and Psychology and was awarded a Need Based Scholarship through the University South Foundation, Inc. in the Fall of 2014.

When asked how this scholarship would help her she replied: "This scholarship has not only helped me maintain my 4.0 GPA but also helped me to not be so stressed over the bills that I had to pay. It gave me peace of mind. As a result of receiving this scholarship, I was able to participate in research with my current mentors. It also added to my CV because I was able to put down that I won this award."

Ms. Chavarria continued to share her advice for other students. "Even though this scholarship was a need based scholarship, I still had to write an opening statement and also answer the writing prompt that the scholarship committee gave. Having strong writing skills is a big help but I believe the best advice that I can give is having different people look over your application. This helped me to better express myself and I believe it helped the scholarship committee understand what you are trying to express because so many people looked over the application before they did."




Make a Difference with Planned Giving

Highlights from Patterson Observatory

The University South Foundation, Inc. owns and maintains the Patterson Observatory located on University of Arizona Sierra Vista Campus. The Huachuca Astronomy Club (HAC) volunteers operates the observatory and hosts Public Viewing Nights each month. These "Public Nights" are free and family friendly and start about a half hour after sunset. They are weather dependent (canceled during inclement weather) and are not scheduled during the monsoon months of July and August. Public Nights are announced in the Around Your Town section of the Sierra Vista Herald, in the Mountain View News, on the HAC website, and on Facebook.



The Patterson Observatory is listed as a NASA Space Place and has a 16 foot dome, housing a Ritchey-Chretien telescope of 20" aperture. This telescope, with its sophisticated detectors, is capable of observing objects one million times fainter than the human eye can detect.

During 2014, the University South Foundation purchased a Sprectrograph for the Observatory. Spectroscopy is a powerful tool in astronomy -- from it, we can often get information about the temperature, density, composition, and important physical processes of an astronomical object; like movement toward or away from us, expansion, contraction, rotation, variability etc. HAC members will use the spectroscope as a teaching tool and to do science. HAC can do demonstrations of spectroscopy for public night, and can do real science that might contribute to the study of asteroids, variable stars, double stars, supernovae, and planetary nebulae. The astronomy instructor at Cochise College is eager to bring his classes to Patterson to demonstrate spectroscopy.

The Huachuca Astronomy Club and the University South Foundation's Patterson Observatory offered a FREE seven week Introductory Self-enrichment Exploration of Astronomy Class in the Fall of 2014. Participants encountered the fundamental concepts of practical modern astronomy and had the opportunity to view the night sky through the Patterson observatory's telescope under the supervision of experienced amateur astronomers. The classes were fun and without tests, homework or grades. Classes were instructed by HAC volunteers: Bob Gent, Ted Forte and David Roemer. Nine students received a certificate of completion.

The observatory is also available, by appointment, to serve youth, school and community organizations. The following organizations utilized the Observatory Facilities in 2014: the Sierra Vista Car Club, Flory Simon's Teacher Group, Cochise College STEM Day, CCF Grants, Randy Holler's Buena Class, UA South MACS Club, Desert Eagle Security Instruction Classes, CC Physics Camp, Girl Scouts Troops, First Bethel Sierra Vista Church and Boy Scouts Troops.
