



### Discovery Gardens Fence Project





The University South Foundation, Inc. owns and maintains the Patterson Observatory located on University of Arizona Sierra Vista Campus. The Huachuca Astronomy Club (HAC) volunteers operate the observatory and hosts school field trips, tours, and public viewing nights.

These "Public Nights" are free and family friendly and start about a half hour after sunset. They are weather dependent (canceled during inclement weather) and are not scheduled during the monsoon months of July and August. Space is limited and guests must register. The observatory is also available, by appointment, to serve youth, school and community organizations.


First Public Night of the Year at Patterson Observatory. Returns on April 22, 2021 - RSVP to attend.

The Patterson Observatory has been employed to do scientific research with professional groups from MIT, Austin and Europe, to explore white dwarf exoplanets and triple star candidates. This scientific project is managed by HAC Astronomers, Tom Kaye and Bruce Gary. Some modifications, at no cost to the Foundation, have been made and will benefit the Observatory's future endeavors.
