#### USF Awards \$41,000 in Scholarships in 2012

The Foundation made 2012 an excellent year for many University of Arizona students. A total of \$41,000 in scholarships were awarded, and a few students were repeat winners. In the spring, \$11,000 was given to students, mostly provided by the Foundation. A \$1,000 scholarship was provided by Cecilia Mata.

In fall, the scholarship amount rose sharply to \$30,000, with six \$1,000 awards named for Dine Under the Stars sponsors, including La Casita, SSVEC, Arizona Lottery, New Frontier Animal Hospital, Rosemont Copper, and Fort Huachuca Flower Shop. Twelve scholarship awards were given directly through the University South Foundation. Four \$1,000 scholarships and eight \$2,500 scholarships were awarded in either superior academics, or financial need.

Faculty, staff, award winners and their families, and of course Foundation members were in attendance at the spring and fall scholarship receptions. With the help of Jim Shockey, Dean of Students at University of Arizona South; President Michael Boardman and V.P. Kendra Bergman took turns congratulating students on their awards.

The scholarship reception has become a new opportunity to meet the best of the best the University has to offer. We have also had regular attendance by local press. Overall, many have

While still legally University of Arizona South, the school will do business as University of Arizona-Sierra Vista, once again. Each campus will use it's location name.

While the name may have changed, the initiatives have only grown. The Cochise Cats program is booming, with new students enrolled through the Cochise College/UA SV program. The curriculum continues to be enhanced, as well. The BAS in Intelligence Studies and MA in International Security are both new options created with military students in mind. UA Sierra Vista also has a location on Fort Huachuca.

#### 11th Annual Dine Under the Stars Has a Big Year

Dine Under the Stars turnout was average, but the results were definitely not! The big uptick this year was sponsorship income, with SIX new businesses either donating money or in-kind offerings. The \$10,850 in sponsorship money accounted for a 97% increase over 2011 sponsorships.

Income saw a 35% increase from 2011 at \$19,303, and expenses dropped 5% over the previous year (\$5,496.) Our net proceeds were \$13,808, up 63%. The biggest surprise of the night was a big bear donated by Anne Borowiec, and it's extraordinary silent auction purchase price of \$450! (See photo

below.) The Foundation also presented a framed photo to Bob Gent for the work he has done with the Patterson, as well as certificates to sponsors, including Phil and Anita Garcia of La Casita Restaurant.

Another big improvement this year was the 50/50 raffle sale turnout. We brought in \$815, which was a \$608 increase over 2011.

The attendees were delighted this year to receive a special gift bag full of goodies from Dillard's at the Mall of Sierra Vista. We also had beautiful centerpieces, (see below), provided by

Fort Huachuca Flower Shop, which were included in the silent auction, bringing in an additional \$250. DUTS 2012 was branded "Latin Night," and the food, dance, and décor stayed true to the theme. La Casita provided extra latin flair in their food, and the Alma Dolores dancers didn't disappoint with their cha-chas!
